Further Thoughts on Conserving Water

Last month we featured water saving ideas including one from new member Jim Boso about reusing water in his pond that had been flushed from his filter. Our friend Jerry Kyle from Sacramento saw this article and recognized that it might pose a problem to your koi's health and sent this alternative idea.

Jerry's Take

This is a great idea to save water in these parched times and I applaud the idea but, there is a better use for the water than putting it back in the pond. If you put it back in the pond you will still have to buy water from the water company to water the roses and whatever else you have.

That water from the city is full of chlorine that plants can, if they have to, live with but, they would prefer not to have to deal with all that darn chlorine in there.

Does your water have chloramines? Plants would prefer not having that even more. The city water also has very little plant nutrients so we go to LOWES and buy products with nitrates for growth and plant health.

Darn stuff cost more each year. What if we take Jim's idea and modify it?

The waste water in the barrels has had the chlorine gassed off by the pond aeration system and wonderful nitrates added in an amount that will thrill the roses. They do not necessarily like having a bunch of nitrates dumped on them from time to time but, just love a little at a time more consistently.

Yum. Happy plants grow bigger roses. The Koi will be happy helping the roses since the Koi will get first use of the water originally intended for the roses and by later passing it on to the garden the Koi will also be passing on the excess nitrates that if allowed to build up too much in the pond water will eventually suppress the Koi immune system.

A side benefit is that the pheromones (hormones?) build up that the Koi give off into the water and can effect growth gets diluted with more fresh water. That old fallacy that Koi can not grow big in small ponds is wrong.

Doc Johnson proved that years ago. Mother Nature has her Koi emit a hormone into the water that can be sensed by others and inhibits growth as a protection device to protect them from environmental disasters (getting so big there is not enough natural food supply?) caused by overcrowding.

Increased water changes to reduce the hormones promote bigger Koi and is another reason to use Jim's idea without returning the water to the pond. Consider taking these ideas to the next level and doing all the garden watering out of the pond.

Some of us have installed a hose valve on the line returning water to the pond from the filter and have an automatic refill valve (like on the toilet) to slowly refill the pond water level only as needed.

Those big regular water changes that raise the water bill (causing too many do not do it) are no longer needed. No more water purchased for the pond, less nitrates purchased for the roses, no buildup of pheromones to suppress growth make happy Koi keepers and saves money.

The idea of adding the barrels to save the back-flush water, raise it on a pedestal, and install a hose bib on the bottom in order to use gravity to feed the hose for that water will save even more water that is wasted by too many. Thanks to Jim for that idea. It is why we join a Koi & Garden Club. That and great food at the potlucks. Enjoy having bigger, healthier, happier Koi.....Jerold Kyle, KHA.

Listed below is the first section of bylaw changes we wish to discuss:

Section B

The duties of the Officers shall be:

Secretary

1. To keep all records of the meetings, including meetings of the Executive Committee Board.

2. To send out all notices of regular or special meetings as deemed necessary by the President or Executive-Committee Board. Meeting notices in the Club bulletin are deemed to comply with the bylaws.

3. To submit a summary of each general and executive meeting, including decisions, to be published in the Club newsletter.

4. To maintain a permanent written record of all General, Executive Committee, Board of Directors, Committee, and Special Meeting minutes.

5. To maintain any official records generated by the Club's Officers and Directors.

6. To see that each member are aware of the Bylaws on the website.

6. Treasurer

Treasurer

7 1. To collect and record all dues, special fees, etc., paid to the Club as a result of its activities plus any other moneys due the Club.

8. To send out all membership cards at the appropriate time. Note: such cards are not valid unless signed by the President and/or Secretary.

9. To see that each member receives a copy of the bylaws.

10 2. To prepare and present at each regular meeting a report of the receipts and expenditures during the previous month. That report will also be published in the monthly Newsletter.

11 3. To pay predetermined accounts as may be authorized by the membership of the Club and to pay those bills presented and approved at each regular meeting.

12 4. To prepare and submit all reports required by any governmental agency.

13 5. To make available membership application forms to all that are interested at the regularly scheduled Club meetings.

14. To be sure that all club checks are signed by both the President or Vice President and the Treasurer.

15 6. To verify that all expenditures over \$500 that have not been approved in the annual budget must be approved by the membership.

16 7. To submit present the Treasurer's report for the year to be published in at the November newsletter meeting.


